Academic Scholarships

Board of Trustee Scholarships

This scholarship is available to individuals graduating in the top 20% of their class **OR** having an ACT composite score of 24 or higher. The student must be a first-time entering college student and maintain at least 24 credit hours per year. The award varies from \$100 to \$600 per semester and is renewable with continuous enrollment and a minimum GPA of 3.25 after the first year. The scholarship may be used for tuition, fees, or room and board. Some trustee awards are granted in recognition of employees who have provided extended service to North Central Missouri College. Current and former employees recognized include Fred Arthaud, Linda Buckalew, Don Dalrymple, Karla Hannaford, Bill Hinkebein, Bill Oesterling, Phil Schlarb, Carolyn Smith, Connie Spellman, and Vicki Wheeler. ****Must have a high school counselor or official signature to verify ACT/high school rank.***

GED Merit Scholarships

This scholarship is awarded for outstanding performance on the GED examination. Qualified students must score at least 290 (before 1/1/02) or 2900 (after 1/1/02) on the GED examination, be first-time entering college students, and enroll in at least 6 credit hours. This award is for tuition up to \$500 per semester and is renewable for three semesters with continuous enrollment and a 3.0 minimum grade point average.

General Scholarships

NCMC Foundation/General Scholarship Fund*

Through the generosity of NCMC alumni and supporters of the College, a number of scholarships have been endowed with the College Foundation. This scholarship is for first time NCMC students. The award is for up to \$250 per semester and may be renewed for one semester with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Diversity Scholarships

Diversity scholarships are consistent with North Central Missouri College's mission to provide opportunities for students to communicate more effectively and participate more completely in a diverse and global world. All United States citizens enrolled at, or admitted to, NCMC are eligible for this scholarship. To be considered for this award, applicants must submit with their scholarship application a brief essay describing how they will contribute to the diversity of the student body. The essay should not exceed 500 words and may contain information detailing educational attainments as they relate to foreign, cultural, ethnic, or language studies; life experiences; and/or individual cultural, racial, or ethnic history.

Scholarships will be awarded to those applicants who demonstrate the greatest ability to increase student diversity with financial need a consideration. The scholarship award is \$1500 per academic year for fall and spring semesters and can be used for tuition, fees or room and board; full-time enrollment is required. Scholarships may be renewed for a second year at NCMC's discretion provided the recipient maintains a minimum 2.0 grade point average.

Elizabeth M. Barton Mentorship Awards

This award is a work program for up to \$1,600 per year. Students are required to work approximately eight hours a week during the school year to gain work experiences and to develop skills important for career success.

Allen Moore III and Anne B. Moore Scholarships*

This scholarship may be granted to Livingston County residents demonstrating financial need.

Elizabeth M. Barton Explore College Scholarships*

This award is available to non-traditional, first-time college students 23 years of age and older. This award may pay for tuition/fees up to 6 credit hours and \$75 toward textbooks. The applicant must first apply for a Federal Pell Grant before the award is finalized. If the applicant qualifies for a Pell Grant, the Explore College Scholarship will be reduced or removed accordingly.

Elizabeth M. Barton GED Scholarships

This scholarship is awarded to GED students not meeting the GED Merit Scholarship requirements and is granted for one or two semesters. The award of \$250 per semester is for tuition and may be increased for full-time students.

Missouri Boys State Scholarships

This institutional scholarship is granted to two high school seniors who attended Missouri Boys State. The award is for one year at \$500 per semester. The applicant must have an ACT composite score of 24 or higher OR graduate in the top 20% of their high school class.

Missouri Girls State Scholarships

This institutional scholarship is granted to two high school seniors who attended Missouri Girls State. The award is for one year at \$500 per semester. The applicant must have an ACT composite score of 24 or higher OR graduate in the top 20% of their high school class.

Allied Health Scholarships

Maude K. Ryan Memorial Scholarships

The Maude Ryan Memorial Scholarship honors the former NCMC Allied Health faculty member by awarding a one-year, \$1,500 scholarship to a nursing degree student. Selection for this award is contingent upon NCMC Allied Health faculty recommendation.

Serve Link Home Care Scholarships

Funds for these scholarships are provided by the Serve Link Home Care Agency and awarded to students from the Green Hills area enrolled in the ADN, PN, EMT-Paramedic, and Medical Assistant programs. Scholarships are awarded for two semesters and range from \$1,000 to \$2,000 annually for each program. Selection for the award is contingent upon NCMC Allied Health faculty recommendation.

Departmental Scholarships

North Central Missouri College administers various institutional scholarships granted to students pursuing a specific field of study. The award is in the amount of \$150 per semester with a \$300 per year maximum. Each department is responsible for recommending recipients for the scholarship.
